<u>Section 2: Severability Provision:</u> If any part of this Resolution is held invalid, the remainder of this Resolution shall continue in effect as if such invalid portion never existed.

<u>Section 3: Repeal of Conflicting Resolutions</u>: All ordinances, resolutions, or orders of the City Council, or parts of the same, in conflict with this Resolution are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

ORDINANCE NO. 21-

AN ORDINANCE WAIVING COMPETITIVE BIDDING TO UPGRADE THE CITY OF ROGERS POLICE DEPARTMENTS EVIDENCE STORAGE SYSTEM; ALLOWING THE MAYOR AND CITY CLERK TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE UPGRADE WITH PATTERSON POPE, A COMPANY OUT OF CINCINNATI, OHIO; PROVIDING FOR THE EMERGENCY CLAUSE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the current evidence storage system for the Rogers Police Department is dead and cannot be repaired;

WHEREAS, this has caused an emergency as many employees are locked out of accessing evidence and are unable to complete job duties;

WHEREAS, Patterson Pope is uniquely familiar with the evidence storage needs of the police department and can provide an upgrade to the system;

WHEREAS, the contract amount is thirty thousand three hundred thirty-eight dollars (\$30,338.00); and

WHERERAS, this project will be paid out of 2018 Police Bond Funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS THAT:

Section 1: That the Mayor and City Clerk are authorized to enter into a contract with Patterson Pope, a company out of Cincinnati, Ohio, in the amount of thirty thousand three hundred thirty-eight dollars (\$30,338.00), to upgrade the Rogers Police Department's evidence storage system;

Section 2: There exists an exceptional circumstance whereby the requirements of competitive bidding are neither practical nor feasible and the City Council, therefore, waives the requirements of competitive bidding for the repair work to the sewer pipes;

<u>Section 3:</u> <u>Emergency Clause</u>: The need to upgrade the Police Department's evidence storage system is immediate and in order to protect the public peace, health, safety, and welfare an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of its passage and approval;

Section 4: Severability Provision: If any part of this Ordinance is held invalid, the remainder of this Ordinance shall continue in effect as if such invalid portion never existed; and

Section 5: Repeal of Conflicting Provisions: All Ordinances, Resolutions, or Orders of the City Council, or parts of the same, in conflict with this Ordinance are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ROGERS CODE SECTION 14-675 BY RE-ZONING CERTAIN LANDS FROM A-1 TO R-SF, PROVIDING FOR THE EMERGENCY CLAUSE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Rogers Code Section Rogers Code Section 14-725, et seq, and upon the consideration of the report and recommendations of the Planning Commission of the City of Rogers, Benton County, Arkansas, on February 16, 2021, the City Council has found that certain lands hereinafter described are better suited for R-SF zoning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: That Section 14-675 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Rogers, should be and the same hereby is amended as hereinafter provided.

<u>SECTION 2</u>: That the land hereinafter described should be and the same is hereby zoned as R-SF and that said lands being in Benton County, Arkansas, are described as:

PROPERTY DESCRIPTION:

A PART OF THE FRACTIONAL NW1/4 OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 5, TOWNSHIP 18 NORTH, RANGE 30 WEST, BENTON COUNTY, ARKANSAS, BEING MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS, TO-WIT:

BEGINNING AT A POINT WHICH IS SOUTH 87 DEGREES, 24 MINUTES, 10 SECONDS EAST 30.76 FEET FROM THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SAID FORTY ACRE TRACT AND RUNNING ALONG THE NORTH LINE THEREOF: SOUTH 87 DEGREES, 24 MINUTES, 10 SECONDS EAST 283.53 FEET TO A FOUND RAIL SPIKE, THENCE LEAVING SAID NORTH LINE SOUTH 02 DEGREES, 07 MINUTES, 40 SECONDS WEST 922.77 FEET, THENCE SOUTH 62 DEGREES, 48 MINUTES, 26 SECONDS WEST 351.91 FEET, THENCE NORTH 03 DEGREES, 20 MINUTES, 39 SECONDS EAST 1097.66 FEET TO THE POINT OF BEGINNING, CONTAINING 6.82 ACRES, MORE OR LESS. SECTION 3: Zoning. That the above described lands are better suited for R-SF than A-1 zoning and same should be and are hereby zoned R-SF.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: **Emergency Clause**. That it is necessary to bring proposed uses of the property into conformance with the Rogers City Zoning Ordinances and because of such an emergency is declared to exist and in order to protect the public peace, health, safety and welfare, this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from the date of its passage and approval.

SECTION 5: Severability Provision. In the event that any section, paragraph, subdivision,

clause, phrase, or other provision or portion of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, the same shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision, other than the part so decided to be invalid or unconstitutional, and the remaining provisions of this Ordinance shall be construed as if such invalid, unenforceable or unconstitutional provision or provisions had never been contained herein.

<u>SECTION 6:</u> **Repeal of Conflicting Ordinances and Resolutions**. All ordinances, resolutions or orders of the City Council, or parts of ordinances, resolutions or orders of the City Council in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Rogers Code Section Rogers Code Section 14-725, et seq, and upon the consideration of the report and recommendations of the Planning Commission of the City of Rogers, Benton County, Arkansas, on February 16, 2021, the City Council has found that certain lands hereinafter described are better suited for NBT zoning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: That Section 14-675 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Rogers, should be and the same hereby is amended as hereinafter provided.

SECTION 2: That the land hereinafter described should be and the same is hereby zoned as NBT and that said lands being in Benton County, Arkansas, are described as:

ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ROGERS CODE SECTION 14-675 BY RE-ZONING CERTAIN LANDS FROM R-O TO C-3, PROVIDING FOR THE EMERGENCY CLAUSE AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Rogers Code Section Rogers Code Section 14-725, et seq, and upon the consideration of the report and recommendations of the Planning Commission of the City of Rogers, Benton County, Arkansas, on February 16, 2021, the City Council has found that certain lands hereinafter described are better suited for C-3 zoning.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROGERS, ARKANSAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>: That Section 14-675 of the Code of Ordinances, City of Rogers, should be and the same hereby is amended as hereinafter provided.
