- This legislative process will occur in the upcoming months at both Rogers and Cave Springs City Council meetings as defined by Ark. Code Ann. § 14-40-2101. These legislative meetings are open to the public.
- Rogers values public input during this process. Concerned residents are invited to a public hearing at the respective City Council meeting set tentatively for May 14th, 2024 at 6:30p.m.

Frequently Asked Questions:

- **Why wasn't I made aware of this?**

Legislative action from Rogers City Council was a needed first step to begin the process. Public notification is being sent in the form of a public hearing notice that will be published in the newspaper. Public meetings in both Rogers and Cave Springs are upcoming.

- **Will my utilities be impacted?**

Some utilities (Water, Sewer, Trash) will switch as a result of this change, but it will be coordinated between the Cities and their utility providers. There will be no disruption in services during any transition of utility providers.

- **Will this affect where my child goes to school?**

No, school system boundaries are not affected.

- **How does this affect fire services for areas moving from Rogers to Cave Springs?**

Homes in Cave Springs are serviced by the Cave Springs Fire Department. Rogers Fire Department continually offers mutual aid to surrounding regions and has a good relationship with the Cave Springs Fire Department. All CSFD has to do is request, and RFD will be on scene. The Cities will likely enter into an interlocal agreement concerning fire services so there will be no disruption in the services being currently provided.
